While many head to the beaches in summer, an escape to the mountains is perfect to beat the crowds and have an amazing, adventure-filled summer holiday.

Travel news

Aiming to enjoy a cool summer holiday this year? Well, ditch the overcrowded beaches and head to Isère, a mountain destination in southeastern France. Just a short flight or easy train ride from the UK, this corner of the Alps is wild and beautiful with a varied landscape that spreads across the Vercors, Chartreuse, Oisans and Belledonne massifs.

The perfect place for a family adventure

Overnight at an Alpaca farm in the village of Septème, test your putting skills on a Street Golf course in Alpe D'Huez and take part in a guided nighttime storytelling stroll through the forest in Oz-en-Oisans. Test your physical and cerebral skills along the "Family Raid" course in Les 2 Alpes. Challenges include laser-rifle shooting, biking, an escape game, and more.

Pont-en-Royans, the town shaped by wate

At the 16th-Century village of Pont-en-Royans, a series of narrow homes that hang precariously over the sheer edges of the Vercors cliffs. The village was once an important stop in the timber trade and you can learn more about it on a theatrical tour with 19th-Century lamplighter, loseph.

Discover how else water has helped to shape the Alpine massif with a visit to the Museum of Water. Nearby are the Jardin des Fontaines Pétrifiantes, a wonderfully eccentric garden on the bank of the Isère river.

Jazz in the Roman city of Vienne

The second largest city in Isère after Grenoble, the Roman city of Vienne is famous for its annual Jazz festival that takes place every summer with nearly 200 concerts, many held in the city's Roman theatre at the base of Mont Pipet. To keep toes tapping yearround, the city is welcoming two new jazz clubs. But it's not all about the music, late summer brings the return of 'Historic Vienne', a two-day medieval festival featuring concerts equestrian shows, acrobatics and jousting.

Active mountain adventures

Isère also offers kite surfing, wing foil and wakeboarding on one of the windiest lakes in Europe and surfing in Martelles lake. You can tour Grenoble by canoe, go fishing in highaltitude lakes in Oisans, discover the Platière island nature reserve by bike, and hike to one of the region's many waterfalls. For the more adventurous, try the Via Ferrata and Sautet canyon zip line, spelunking or canyoning in the Vercors and an overnight in a cave at Rencurel
